Re Complaint of Attorney Misconduct by Attorney David G. Tobin

Board of Bar Overseers,

The conduct of attorney David G. Tobin, as Assistant US Attorney practicing in the US District Court in Boston, particularly in case # 10-CR-10124-DPW, is improper and in multiple violation of the Rules of Professional Conduct (RPCs) for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, as follows.

Attorney David G. Tobin:

- 1) Failed to Report the misconduct of another attorney
- 2) Knowingly Presented False Statements in pleadings to the court
- 3) Intentionally Prejudiced a Grand Jury Proceeding
- 4) Intentionally Delayed handover of mandatory Discovery in a criminal proceeding
- 5) Acted out of malice in a prosecution from which he and his associates stood to gain
- 6) Suborned perjury of a witness at a Grand Jury Proceeding [see docket DOCUMENT 88]

As the undersigned had submitted a Petition to Address Attorney Misconduct (of David G. Tobin) on the USDC court record (as Document 52), rewritten by the defendant in the aforementioned case (as Document 59), and as the Petition was denied and no rulings were made as to the conduct, the responsibility falls directly on the Board of Bar Overseers to investigate the claims herein. To be clear, only the failure to report attorney misconduct and knowingly presenting false statements claims were included in the petition request.

The undersigned requests that the BBO respond to this inquiry and provide the complete documented complaint process, in order that the complete and necessary elements and facts (most of which are on the public docket record) be subsequently provided for a proper review.
