

# Litigation Summary of Jeffrey L. Clemens – Phase 1

---

**Incident: October 25, 1994** re False Speeding Ticket, Assault, and Threat by Police Officer Richards

Jeffrey L Clemens sues the City of Bellevue, WA (USDC Seattle) in September 1997 [CASE #1]

Plaintiff Attorney Paul H. King SABOTAGES the case by not updating the filed complaint and serving it

NOTE: Paul H. King was to later be suspended from the practice of law for a separate matter

**Incident: September 23, 1997** re Assault upon Mr. Clemens (falsely citizen arrested for Trespass) at CAA

Jeffrey L. Clemens sues Gavin Debecker & Associates (USDC Los Angeles) in September 1998 [CASE #2]

PRO SE

USDC Judge William Keller DISMISSES the case upon Summary Judgment, despite a defendant default

NOTE: Judge Keller ignored the tolling of statutes on a malicious prosecution claim.

The 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit dismissed the civil appeal and the US Supreme Court denied Mr. Clemens's Petition

**Incident: 1987 through 1995** re CAA and MGM borrowed work product of Mr. Clemens between 1987 and 1995 and obtained financial gain from it, in particular, from the movie "Rain Man"

Jeffrey L. Clemens sues Creative Artists Agency, MGM, Gavin Debecker & Associates, et al [CASE #3]

PRO SE

**SETTLES with three of the defendants for over \$20,000** in December 2002

NOTE: USDC Judge Christina Snyder (former attorney for defendant MGM) dismissed the case upon Rule 12 Motion by one of the parties; no party answered the complaint; motions and appeals to the 9<sup>th</sup> Circuit followed; Mr. Clemens becomes interested in how various judges came to be assigned to the case...Dickran Tevrizian (an MGM investor), George King (who should have ruled on the Rule 12 motion), and Consuelo Marshall (who dismissed the first filing upon an erroneous technical pretext, having nothing to do with the merits)

**Incident: November 12, 1999** (during litigation in Los Angeles) Mr. Clemens is stopped by Douglas County Deputies, for no other reason than the fact that the CHP wanted him stopped but allowed Jeffrey to cross into his home state of Nevada, yet filed no charges; Douglas County files charges for Eluding/Fail to Stop on Signal from Police and Resisting Arrest; prosecutor misleads Jeffrey into (uncounseled) pleading to a traffic violation, but failed to disclose the potential for jail time.

Jeffrey L. Clemens sues Douglas County (NV) in the 2000 to 2002 timeframe [CASE #4]

PRO SE

**SETTLES with Douglas County for \$5,000**

NOTE: Douglas County was very uncooperative during the attempted depositions of county witnesses; there is a sinister connection to the California Highway Patrol and Mono County California that Douglas County did not want the world to know about, apparently. CHP and Mono County filed false reports.

Jeffrey L. Clemens survived **8 years** of official misconduct and tortious acts by police and private firms, including a security and threat management firm, **and 4 lawsuits**, resulting in settlements of **\$25,000**.
