Re Request for Investigation into Crimes Involving Town Police and Counsel

Office of Attorney General,

I have a basic request arising from my personal knowledge of criminal activity by both town police and (relatedly by) a civilian lawyer acting as counsel for the town within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. What government office has authority to investigate – a County District Attorney, or the Attorney General office in Boston, or other?

I do not believe that justice can be achieved if I take this matter to the District Attorney in the County of which the events and an accompanying trial and (eventually reversed on appeal) conviction occurred, as the case may have involved prosecutorial misconduct – there is evidence of such conduct. I am not a directly involved party and I am not the defendant, but I am a very concerned US citizen who has suffered because of these crimes.

Persons Involved

A town police sergeant, the same town's police lieutenant, and the same town's counsel, in particular for the civil litigation arising from the misconduct, a civil case of which was filed over a year before the aforementioned trial, which led to a conviction that was eventually reversed on appeal.

Offenses Committed

Perjury (also, False Reporting)
Suborning of Perjury
Fraudulent Concealment (of Perjury and related false charge)

Not to exclude possibility of other crimes, possibly by others.

Evidence Relied Upon

A provably false Officer Report

(which contradicts 911 call transcripts and Radio Logs; proof does not rely on the accused defendant testimony; the Report formed the basis of a criminal charge made in Court; this case involves a man that was pulled over in his vehicle, told he could go, and then was arrested, then later accused of and charged with Disorderly Conduct – toward the police, of which two officers were present at the time of the arrest)

Civil Deposition Transcripts

(showing the presence of the two aforementioned police officers, witnesses in an arrest, at the same deposition, in which one of the witnesses was providing sworn testimony; the other witnesses – not giving deposition testimony at the time – testified against the accused at a trial the next day)

911 Call Recordings and Transcript and Police Radio Logs

(withheld from the accused defendant and from the public by the town police, in particular, the town police lieutenant; the lieutenant actually made two additional false charges against the accused (Disorderly Conduct) defendant; the lieutenant also transmitted the provably false Officer Report to federal authorities for improper purposes; the 911 transcripts and police radio logs contradict the Officer Report; neither 911 transcripts nor Radio Log transcripts were available to the defendant at his “forced” trial, due to their intentionally delayed delivery to the defendant, imperiling his defense.

Civil Proceedings

(documented withholding by the town’s counsel of witnesses (including police officers and the 911 caller), particularly before a criminal trial for the first charge – held and achieving a conviction, which was later reversed and subsequent Commonwealth request for Supreme Judicial Council review denied)

Requested Action

Where and how do I initiate contact with authorities to handle an investigation into the criminal matter described above? I will provide all my evidence and knowledge about the misconduct when I know that an appropriate authority will handle the matter. I originally thought to withhold the name of the involved county, for the sake of avoiding undue prejudice, but have decided that it would be expedient to disclose the county in which the alleged crimes occurred – Plymouth County.

Please provide a response as soon as possible, as related circumstances imperil my security, the safety of the defendant above, and our civility and rights. Thank you.
