Introduction

The Access To The Courts website was mysteriously expunged and all files destroyed in August 2008, just weeks before the Town of Scituate police officer Michael O'Hara perjured himself, as the lone prosecution witness in a Disorderly Conduct trial against Jeffrey L. Clemens – the featured victim of prejudice since the website was created on June 11, 2005. Much of that prejudice was carried out in Los Angeles by federal agency folks with ties to security and threat management firm Gavin Debecker & Associates, a civil defendant of Jeffrey L. Clemens. "They" were up to no good in March 2010, when US Attorneys in Boston cranked up their malicious prosecution machine again, only this time to shut Mr. Clemens down for good!

The pending status of legal proceedings precludes a discussion of the US v. Jeffrey Clemens case filed in 2010 in Boston, following Ex Parte communication by Town of Scituate counsel Stephen C. Pfaff, illicit and unethical help by US District Court Judge William G. Young, and malice by Assistant US Attorney David G. Tobin, a Suffolk Law 1988 graduate with Scituate counsel Stephen C. Pfaff.
